

The Revised Handbook will ask (Ofsted) inspectors to consider: 'How well the school uses its Sports Premium to improve the quality and breadth of its PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.'

Guidance from the Department of Education

'From Sep 2013 schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.'

Possible uses for the funding include:

Leeds West Academy (LWA) will support the CPD work of the primary school. LWA can offer considerable expertise in all areas of Physical Education. LWA would work with the individual schools and the cluster to ensure needs are met.

How this may look in your school:

Use for funding	What LWA can offer
1) Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE 2) Paying for professional development opportunities in PE / Sport 3) Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE / Sport 4) Buying quality assured professional development modules or	 LWA working alongside staff who require individual training to develop their subject knowledge and confidence. Releasing specialist teachers from LWA to deliver lessons in your school alongside existing staff. This will ensure high quality lessons and also develop the skills of the teacher.(E.g. – dance, outdoor activities etc) The release time could be twofold: eg.1 – dance teacher to come in and deliver alongside a primary teacher or eg.2 – Paul Anderson to cover the primary lesson to allow the teacher to visit LWA and work alongside a specialist dance teacher. Included in the above you will be given support materials (where appropriate) to help in the future delivery of the subject. LWA can be extremely flexible as to how CPD is offered such as working alongside colleagues with their classes, twilights/ staff
5) New or additional Change4Life sport clubs	 meetings or training days. LWA young leaders to run a weekly Enrichment Programme which can focus on a particular group of pupils. This can be held
	 either at your school or LWA on a Monday from 3:00. Sixth form students and other junior sports leaders could also come into primary schools to deliver training / clubs which also develops their own skill base to allow them to complete their course requirements.
	 Paul and apprentices to develop specific target groups in schools (E.g. – Pupil Premium) and train them as young leaders or any other identified need. (E.g. – raise confidence, using sport to as a vehicle to improving literacy skills, behaviour etc) Develop young leader schemes for those who are at risk of

to develop their own young leaders in sport. Additionally, leaders from LWA can be utilised to deliver coaching and competition preparation either in your school or at LWA.

6) Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games

(LWA would work with all schools to plan an inter school competition calendar, offering a varied menu of options to engage a wider range of pupils. Intraschool competitions, which are open to all pupils, could also be supported by utilising young leaders from LWA. LWA would continue to identify and signpost G+T pupils to appropriate pathways and partners.)

 All pupils in all school years to have the opportunity to take part in sport, not just the few selected for the teams. E.g Year 2 FUNdamentals etc..

LWA will provide assistance for primary schools that are looking

 Examples of tournaments that can be arranged, schools can select which competitions meet their demands. Eg. Football, netball, tennis, table tennis, cricket, tag rugby, frisbee, climbing, rounders, fitness challenge etc.. (others can be arranged upon request!)

7) Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs

- Ensuring holiday club environments are safe for pupils and LWA safeguarding procedures are followed.
- Developing existing links with local clubs eg. Stanningley Rugby Club, Rodley Cricket Club, Bramley Phoenix and local authorities eg. Bramley Baths for use during holidays.
- Tailor make opportunities for specific target groups (eg. G&T, behaviour, transition clubs) and their individual needs during curricular and non-curricular time eg. school holidays and after school clubs.
- Use Leeds West Academy network to promote holiday activities
 current examples of this work include a stronger link with Bramley Baths.

Outdoor and Adventurous Activities (OAA)

LWA young leaders to run a weekly Enrichment Programme which can focus on a particular group of pupils. Outdoor & Adventurous Activities (OAA) and residential work has tremendous potential to develop the personal development and social skills of our young people. Pupils from the West Leeds area are often very limited in their opportunities to access OAA and pressures due to H+S and staff expertise means schools have been limited in their offer. LWA would like to work with schools to increase the opportunities in this area. This could be achieved by helping schools to deliver OAA using LWA staff and resources to deliver exemplar sessions.

How this may look in your school:

- Use of LWA climbing wall and mountain bikes.
- The opportunity to develop a 'mini D of E' experience based at LWA in preparation of the possibility of completing the full award at high school and at the appropriate age.
- Risk assessments and insurance provided by LWA.

For £2500 per year (if all 9 Primary School sign up):

- 2 hours a week with Paul and his team in your school, leading sessions and training your staff;
- 4 Twilight Sessions at Leeds West Academy to train your staff;
- The opportunity for Primary staff to come in to LWA to observe PE staff in action;
- Participation in regular cross-Primary sporting competitions;
- Opportunities to be involved in all the initiatives discussed above.
