

In English we will continue to read 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman and use this text within our writing.

Year 4 are making super progress with learning to play chess and are already able to use all the pieces in a full game. Other Y4 learning; HISTORY

We will be starting to learn about the Victorians, focusing on our local area of Stanningley and how it developed during the Victorian era. This learning will continue in the Summer Term when we concentrate on Victorian childhoods.

The Y4 science unit this half term is 'Power it up!'

This unit explores 'Electricity'. The children will revisit some uses of electricity and the importance of safety before constructing simple circuits. They will then learn how to change a circuit by changing the components' make up.

HOMEWORK

We thank you for your support with homework – we can really see the impact that practice at home has on independent school work.

It is important that the children continue with their weekly spelling sentences. Please encourage your child to extend their sentences and to use a range of openers when completing the spelling task.

We will continue to set multiplication tables for Learn by Heart tests in preparation for the Y4 statutory test in June. Using Times Tables Rock Stars is another great way to learn tables.

READING BOOKS

Please ensure that you complete your child's reading log on a regular basis. Whatever the reading level, we recommend that children continue to read at home to an adult a minimum of three times weekly. The children are all aware that, in order for them to change their book in school, a comment or signature from home is required. We have introduced a sticker chart in class to encourage children to read at home.

** Reminders **

PE days are indoor PE on MONDAY and outdoor PE on FRIDAY.

Please wear suitable PE uniform:

Indoor clothing = plain white <u>round necked</u> T-shirt, black shorts, leggings or tracksuit bottoms (without stripes or logos) and school pumps. Children must have bare feet for gymnastics unless they have medical reasons not to.

Outdoor clothing = plain white round necked t-shirt, plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms and **trainers.**

- A school hoody will be provided by the school for outdoor use when the weather is cold.
- In colder months, the children can substitute leggings/joggers for shorts.

Children also need to wear or bring footwear suitable for the Daily Mile.

Jewellery must be removed before school including earrings.
